This material, which appeared originally in Bibliotheca Sacra, is exactly what the title states. The author, who is librarian at Talbot Theological Seminary, has collected important and representative books, pamphlets, articles and charts which show the development of dispensationalism from its earliest forms to the present day. Two-thirds of the book concerns post-Reformation entires(which is to be expected), though the author begins his study with early ~~sex-~~ and septa-millennial theories.

Although contemporary dispensational articles are listed, ~~the~~ specific ~~the~~ the disepnsational teachings of contemporary teachers might have been spelled out/ in the text.
