This last sbuject is as fairly and thouroughly treated by Sauer as anywhere to the reviewer's knowledge. Although the author himself prefers the view that the days of Genesis 1 means periods, he presents objectively all the evidence for other wiew interpretations.

The author is well-known for his reverent scholarship, and as a true schloar he writes so that his readers can understand what he is saying!
