"Jesus" in the first chapters of Acts is the human name of our Saviour. It is the theme of the Apostolic preaching.

The Jews had refused to receive Him as the One sent from God, and had crucified Him. The only terms of salvation are bound up with their reception of the "MAN" whom God had sent. Note the word in :-

Acts 13:38. "And by this Man is preached unto you the forgiveness of sins". (Man not in text)
1 Cor. 15:21. "For since by man came death, by MAN came also the resurrection."

Lk. 23:4. "I find no fault in this Man"

Lk. 23:47. "Certainly this was a righteous man"
Jno. 19:5. "Behold the MAN"
