The Classification of New Testament Citations

It may be of some help to us in the beginning of our studies to be clear on definitions, or common classifications, of terms used in the study of the Old Testament in the New Testament.

Material from the Old Testament is usually classified in two ways:

- (1) First, as <u>quotations</u>, that is, material in which the text of the Old Testament is reproduced in the New Testament accounts. We may further classify the quotations into:
- (a) First, intentional and explicit quotations, accompanied by an introductory formula (cf. , etc.). Cf. Rom. 9:17, 13. This classification, as is easily seen, is based upon both subjective adn objective factors.
- (b) Second, intentional and implicit quotations, unaccompanied by an introductory formula. Cf. Rom. 9:7; Heb 10:37-38.
- (2) Second, as <u>allusions</u>, that is, material in which the text of the Old Testament is more loosely referred to in the New Testament. Of course, the question of <u>how much</u> use of the Old Testament constitutes an allusion cannot be determined to the satisfaction of all. Generally speaking, it is usually taken for granted that <u>two or more</u> consecutive words from the Old Testament must be used in the new.

It is possible to further classify the allusions in this way:

- (a) First, the allusions in which the author's <u>intention</u> to allude is descernible with some degree of certainty.
- (b) Second, the allusions in which this intention does not appear to be present. It is readily apparent that this further classification is grounded upon considerations that are inclined to be subjective. A rigorous investigation of the context of the allusion is the only protection against subjectivism that the interpreter has.

The Classification of the Use of New Testament Citations

The classification of the <u>use</u> of the citations is another matter. Generally speaking, we may classify their <u>use</u> in three ways, or according to three standards.

(1) First, we may classify the use of the Old Testament citations textually. That is, we may classify them according to their agreement with the well-known forms in which the Old Testament has been handed down to us.

- (2) Second, we may classify the use of the Old Testament citations hermeneutically. For example, quotations may be made for these purposes:
- (a) First, for purposes of <u>illustration</u> of the New Testament text. Cf. I Cor. 1:18.
- (b) Second, for purposes of <u>application</u> of eternal principles found in an Old Testament passage.
- (c) Third, for purposes of indicating <u>fulfillment</u> of Old Testament prophecies, whether directly or indirectly (cf. typological passages). Cf. Rom. 9:7; 11:25-27; Heb. 1:10-12.
- (d) Fourth, simply for the purpose of <u>using the language</u> of the quotation as the best vehicle for the expression of the truth, that is, <u>rhetorically</u>. Cf. Rom. 10:5-8 (?), 15.

And many students feel there are other purposes, as well as refinements and further classifications within some of these.

(3) Third, we may classify the use of the Old Testament citations theologically. That is, we may relate them each to the areas of biblical doctrine to which they make a contribution.
