

THE MORAL DECISION. By Edmond Cahn. Indiana University Press, Bloomington, Indiana,

Although not a theological work, this book is not entirely unrelated to the field of theology, for it is a lawyer's very expert presentation of the store of moral insight and experience that American courts have developed over the years. Each topic begins with an actual case history which reveals the moral forces that operate in our society and concludes with the author's own evaluation and criticism. In its field and relative to the particular questions it raises it is a very stimulating book.
