

Salvation Is Forever. By Robert Glenn Gromacki. Chicago: Moody, 1973. 188 pp. \$2.50.

This is not a treatment of the entire doctrine of salvation, but is primarily a defense of the doctrine of eternal security. However, the author, professor of Bible and Greek at Cedarville College, does deal with certain other aspects of soteriology such as depravity and the blessings of salvation. In the latter discussion (chapter 2), there are brief explanations of key ideas such as predestination, justification, sonship, sanctification, etc.

Three of the six chapters of this book deal directly with the subject of eternal security. The author's presentation is clear, his principles are scriptural, and his exposition of problem passages adequate. He feels that Hebrews 6 is likely an example of the sin unto death. John 15 is explained as the removal of a Christian from a fruit-bearing position. The closing chapter is a plea for spiritual maturity.

The work is well thought out, but no outline is given within the chapters, which makes the discussion less easy to follow.

To sum up: a handy, helpful treatment of a basic doctrine.
