



SYLLABUS

I. COURSE CONTENT

A delineation and defense of the dispensational premillennial position of the University as it relates to the great prophetic truths of Scripture, including a discussion of the distinct origin, nature and destiny of the Church as a work of the Spirit. Prerequisite: Bi 415. 3 credits.

II. OBJECTIVES

That the student:

- A. Comprehends dispensational theology and its relationship to other theological systems.
- B. Applies personally the practical and spiritual benefits of correctly handling these doctrines.
- C. Correctly interprets the Word of God as a basis for the student's theological position.
- D. Comprehends these major doctrines.
- E. Defends biblically and skillfully his/her theological position.
- F. Develops increasing consistency in modeling the lifelong spiritual and intellectual growth associated with these doctrines.

III. REQUIREMENTS

- A. Memorization of Central Passages
You must know the references (book and chapter only) and subjects in *Basic Theology* under "The Church" and "The Future," pp. 618-619, but only the ones indicated on this syllabus with each exam.
- B. Reading
 1. Ryrie, *Dispensationalism*, chapters 1-3 and 5-7, 9-10, 12.
 2. Ryrie, *Basic Theology*, chapters 69-92. Assigned sections to be read *before* each class.
 3. Benware, *Understanding End Times Prophecy*, pp. 133-145, 157-210, 279-309.
- C. Writing
Personal doctrinal statement. You may use notes from other doctrine classes and *Basic Theology*, but do not use other prepared doctrinal statements such as PBU's or your church's. It should be about 6 typewritten pages, preferably in outline form. Give special attention to inerrancy, creation, salvation, gifts of the Spirit, distinctiveness of the body of Christ, the local church and the rapture. This will be due at 6:30 PM October 29th. No late papers will be accepted. Grade will be "S" or "U". If "U" you will be expected to rewrite it or sections of it until satisfactory.
- D. Exams: **September 11th, October 9th, and November 6th. All exams will begin at 9:00 AM**
- E. Completion of the AABC Bible Exam. Examination date to be announced.

NOTE: All written work handed into the professor must include the student's mailbox number. Papers without box numbers will not be returned. (Any student that has not been assigned a mailbox needs to indicate that on all their work following their name. For example: John Doe - **No Box**. These students will pick up their graded work in the Bible Department - please see the secretary for details).

IV. METHODS

- A. Lecture, discussions, debates, dramas and "Ryrie Roulette."
- B. Questions always encouraged.
- C. Grading: Each exam 33 $\frac{1}{3}$ %. Class participation can tilt your grade up. A "U" on your doctrinal statement can lower your grade even though you eventually bring it up to an "S."
