





## TRANSITIONS IN THE BOOK OF ACTS (The Baptism or Indwelling of the Holy Spirit)




- 1. Acts 1:8 Describes the sequential transitions (Jews, Samaritans, Gentiles) that took place in the book of Acts.

## OBSERVATIONS

- 1. It took a while to get things <u>normalized</u>. In moving from one age to the next, there was a transition period in each case.
- 2. During the transitions, many <u>Unique Things</u> took place that were not designed to be <u>normative</u> for the age.
- 3. There are specific historical books that record the <u>transition</u> to explain how we got to where we are.
  - 1. The Gospels and book of Acts (the historical books) record some of the <u>unique Things</u> things that took place during the transition period from the age of law to the age of grace (in order to set up the church age).
  - 2. The Epistles (doctrinal books) record those things which are to be <u>normative</u> for the whole church age.
