I. Categories of People as They Relate to Alcohol

II. Some Statistics

A. Alcohol is the third leading cause of death in U.S. after cancer and heart disease.

B. If 12 people drink for 10 years, 1 will become alcoholic and 3 problem drinkers.

C. Alcohol -related costs run more than \$100 billion in U.S. yearly.

D. The grain used to make alcoholic beverages in 1 year in U.S. would feed 20 million people for one year.

E. Wine in N.T. times was greatly diluted with water, varying from 1-to-1 to 20-1, the average about 3 parts of water to 1 of wine.

III. Biblical Statements

A. Warnings

3. Those who took a Nazarite vow could not drink wine or strong drink, Numb. 6:3-4

B. Legitimate uses

1. Deaden pain of the dying, Prov. 31:6

2. Poured on wounds, Luke 10:34

3. For stomach trouble and infirmities, 1 Tim. 5:23. This verse makes it clear that up to that time Timothy was abstaining.

IV. Alcohol and Church Leaders

A. Elders

1. Temperate, 1 Tim. 3:2. Means a sobriety that comes from nonuse of wine. This also applies to the wives of deacons, 3:11.

2. Not addicted to wine, 1 Tim. 3:3; Titus 1:7. Means not alongside wine; i.e., not a frequenter of affairs where wine is used.

B. Deacons

Not addicted to much wine, 1 Tim. 3:8. Means not giving assent to wine.

V. A Summary Verse--Romans 14:21 (cf. 1 Cor. 6:12; 8:13). Why not do the good thing and abstain?
