

## THEOLOGY 102

### Purposes and goals for the course:

1. To study the doctrines of angels, Satan, demons, man and sin.
2. To relate these doctrines to contemporary problems in demonology, anthropology, etc.
3. To give an apologetic for creationism.

### Requirements for the course:

1. Read Chafer, Systematic Theology, Vol. II.
2. A book review on either Unger, Demons in the World Today, or Lindsey, Satan Is Alive and Well. . . of no more than 2 typed, double-spaced pages (500 words) due the end of the 3rd class week.
3. A file of data about evolution from Davidheiser, Evolution and Christian Faith and Wilder Smith, Man's Origin, Man's Destiny due the end of the 8th class week.
4. Three exams.

## OUTSIDE READING FOR THEOLOGY 102

On April 1 you are to turn in three book reviews, one from each of the three divisions of books listed below. At the beginning of each review indicate the title, author, publisher, pages and price. Start each review on a separate sheet of paper. Minimum length is 200 words and the absolute maximum length is 400 words. Suggestions for writing reviews: (1) capture the interest of the reader; (2) presume that you are writing for a typical cross-section of Christians, like the readership of Moody Monthly; (3) identify the author but don't give his pedigree; (4) divulge the contents of the book without giving chapter titles; (5) judge the book on the basis of its own stated aim (if you don't like the aim, write your own book); (6) don't be picayunish; (7) do be succinct.
